This year's theme is "It's A Great...," authored by Sister Nilda Albino, President of the Philippine Seventh Day Baptist Association, an umbrella organization which embodies three Philippine Seventh Day Baptist Conferences. We are encouraging prayers each day of the week for all countries in the world where Seventh Day Baptists exist; not just the countries which are members of the World Federation.

It's A Great Power — Faith And Determination.

2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." (NKJV)

s a new year approaches, people are thinking about, and listing new year's resolutions. To some people, it is an inspiration for life's focus all throughout the year. So, a list is made. But somehow, we fail to achieve our goals, so we end up with a feeling of frustration. Some of us blame friends, family members, and others. Failure occurs sometimes, when we do not anticipate ahead of time, the things which can possibly cause us to fail. There is nothing wrong with making new year's resolutions, but the question is: Can you keep them? Are we able to convince ourselves that this year will be different?

One of the primary reasons for our shortcomings and failure is our negative chains of habit. Habits are the patterns of conduct that we perform. Negative chains of habit are often too weak to be felt, until they are too strong to be broken. The force of habit is often stronger than the force of resolution made by will that is weak and defective. So then, if a person is going to change his negative habit, a double force must be applied that is greater than the pull of the negative habit. That's where faith in God and the determination to obey God's will must be applied, rather than a list of new

year's resolutions. When a person takes the step of faith to let Jesus Christ enter into his life as a living person, then everything within his life is made new. A new life declaration with faith and determination begins, and the power to live a positive life begins as well.

The means for a higher level of success is in the power of one's faith in God and the determination to follow and obey His will. Faith can move mountains and make everything possible. Faith can cause heaven to open for you and me. The Apostle Paul made a life resolution when he says, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." (Philippians 1:2) That is far beyond simply a resolution statement. It is coupled with a determination proving his new life in Christ. Let us then have a strong faith in God and the determination to obey His will, for everything is possible with God.

Philippians 3:13-14, "Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended, but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

(NKJV)

Il people who are spiritually mature can think the way the Apostle Paul is thinking. A mature person has a set of goals in life. Sometimes difficulties occur in reaching those goals. The Apostle Paul uses some principles in reaching his goals. One of them is, "forgetting the past." But realistically, to do such a thing is quite difficult. Those past experiences of failures and mistakes, of sorrows and disappointments, have already engraved in the mental memory of a person, that such things are too difficult to remove. They keep on ringing in the mind and heart. Therefore, many people are struggling with this reality, and some people just live in a world of broken pieces that they just can't put behind them. The Apostle Paul had been successful in forgetting his past. Perhaps he used the principle of "delete." He did not dwell on the mental rehearsing of his past, but instead, he reprogrammed his mind, by thinking about positive things which are good and worthy of praise and honorable in God's sight; things that are beautiful and respectable to all. I believe that the Apostle Paul also used a special element to reach his goal; the power of self-determination through faith in God. He also said, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:13) With strong courage, that allowed him to surely reach his eternal goal, which is equal to life above.

It's A Great Reminder — The Precious Memories Of Yesterday.

Joshua 4:1-6, 20, 24. Key verse: 24
"That all the peoples of the earth may
know the hand of the Lord that it is
mighty, that you may fear the Lord
your God forever." (NKJV)

There is an old folks saying that is worth repeating here: "Today is the yesterday of tomorrow." Perhaps it is. Joshua led the people of God, the Israelites, to cross the Jordan river toward the promised land. After they had crossed, God told Joshua to choose twelve men from among the people; one from each tribe, and to take up twelve stones from the middle of the Jordan river right where the priest stood. So at the order of Joshua, each of them had carried a stone upon their shoulder and put it in their places where they stayed that night.

The stone served as a tangible memorial object for their encounter with God's supernatural intervention upon them crossing the Jordan river. This shows us that when we encounter difficulties as we travel along life's roads; difficulties we can hardly bear, we can be sure that God's mighty hand is there for us to help us all the way through.

The stones serve as a memorial for the future generations to know how God is faithfully directing His people by His mighty hand. God is a God of the past, present, future and forever. He never changes. God, in His faithfulness, is continuing His mighty act in preserving, directing, intervening, and maintaining or sustaining life on earth. Therefore, whatever lies before

us, we can trust the faithfulness of God and we are secure in His mighty hand. The effect of our personal encounter with God serves as our memories for tomorrow, so that the next generation may see and develop their own personal faith and trust in our God. If during the time of Joshua, they had stones as tangible objects that the future generation could see and touch. we who live in this present time called Christians, have also the cross of Jesus as a tangible object to show to the next generation about our personal encounter with the Lord Jesus. Our salvation was completed on the cross, and we receive it by having faith in Him who died on that cross. The essential evidence that we have encountered the Lord, is our changed life, and we have the precious memory of that moment. And the cross of Jesus serves as a great reminder.

Psalm 90:12 "So teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." (NKJV)

he most important thing that a man should think about with regards to time is the brevity of life. Time is precious. because it is a God-given gift to be used by us, given in His grace. It is of far greater value than any monetary figures. Therefore, we must take advantage of every opportunity that time provides us, to serve God and to do His will. Of course, that does not mean that we have to work every single moment of our lives. No. we have to take a break and look around us at our surroundings to enjoy them. God made them for us to enjoy. We need God's wisdom to be in our hearts and minds, in order for us to grow wise in using our time. We cannot afford to be unproductive with the use of our time. An example of unproductive use of time is someone who possesses "afterwards mentality," because of worldly entanglements or family cares, such as portrayed in the scriptures in Matthew 8:21, "Afterwards mentality" is also exemplified in the form of personal convenience in Acts 24:25. But our highest aim in life is to glorify and honor God. Therefore, we must manage our God-given gift of time as we reverence the Lord our God. Let us invest our time for eternity.

It's A Great Chance — Life's Opportunity.

Revelation 3:8a, "I know your works. See, I have set before you an open door and no one can shut it." (NKJV)

come people say, "Opportunity of-Item knocks only once at the door of life." Failure to hear its sometimes dim sound can cause us to continue doing something the same way, day after day, not realizing that there is a better way. Opportunity has been defined as "a special arrangement of circumstances, offering a person a chance to step in with ideas for something new, something better, something unique." Opportunity indicates a favorable occasion, time or a place of learning. It implies doing new things. It offers a means to express oneself. Opportunity does not always arrive neatly gift-wrapped. There are times that it will arrive in the form of failure, disappointment, or even persecution. The Apostle Paul is an example of that. When he was seized and put in prison, probably in Ephesus, Paul grasped that dangerous or risky opportunity of presenting his claim of the Lordship of Jesus Christ. He defended his claim in court with aggressiveness as we see in Acts 24-26.

I believe opportunity does not always appear only to a single individual. Sometimes it appears in the purview of thousands of people's vision, and yet only few persons will have the keenness to recognize it. So, some people are able to grasp it, while others bypass it, and they don't realize that an opportunity was there. Some people take advantage of every opportunity because of personal greed, and they become opportunists. Many opportunities require the willingness

to step out and take a risk. For opportunities to have success, they need a reliance upon the help of God. God's provision and supervision through His Word, are available and He exhorts us to complete obedience to Him. Joshua 1:8 says, "Do not let the word of the Lord depart from your mouth; meditate upon it day and night so you will be careful to obey it. Then you will be prosperous and successful."

We do not need to wait for the opportunity to knock at our door, but we need to be diligent and continue doing productive things, while looking out for our breakthroughs. We must always check our heart motives which help us to evaluate the reason for pursuing our opportunities. The right motive must be for the glory of our God, focusing toward eternity and the life above.
