

**Expected Conduct at Conference Week 2024**  
**July 21-28, 2024, Buckhannon, WV**

1. We desire to maintain our witness for Christ. Part of this witness is our ability to live as a community that recognizes the responsibility to think of others. Please be considerate and kind to all in your interactions, including with the Conference Week Team and the college/university staff.
2. Local rules of the school and facility are binding on all who attend Conference Week unless changed by the Conference Week Team or the General Council. This includes any public health guidelines that may be in effect.
3. Any questions, concerns, or feedback regarding the program, facilities, meals, lodging, schedule, etc. for Conference Week 2024 should be addressed to the Conference Week Team via the provided channels in your welcome packet. College/University staff will only address concerns with the Conference Week Team.
4. All socializing between males and females (except those related to one another) shall be limited to public areas or personal rooms with doors open (except during quiet hours).
5. Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. each night of Conference Week 2024. During quiet hours, no excessive noise will be permitted. This includes no talking in hallways and no music (such as instrumental, vocal, or from a device) will be permitted except when used with personal headphones. Quiet talking will be permitted in public lounges (mixed gender) or in personal rooms with the doors closed (same gender or family only).
6. A Disciplinary Council shall be established before Conference Week convenes. The Disciplinary Council shall deal with behavioral issues and infractions of these guidelines. Discipline will match the offense and could include being asked to leave the event with no refund.
7. All unmarried minors (under 18 years old) will need to have their own parent(s) or a sponsor over 25 years of age attend the Conference. These minors will be assigned to rooms on the same floor of the same dorm as their sponsors. Parents or sponsors assume full responsibility for the conduct and actions of their minors.
